

Sport Premium Grant at Kingsmoor

The Department for Education have given funding to support the delivery of PE and School Sport. Most schools with primary-age pupils receive the PE and Sport Premium. Kingsmoor Primary School received £8695 in the financial year 2016/17 per annum and £8687 in the financial year 2015/16.

During the academic year 2015-2016 the school has used the Sport Premium to improve the quality of PE and Sport provision in many ways.

Examples of how the funding has had an impact on the quality of our PE and Sport provision

We have specialist PE staff that work during curriculum time with our pupils and who work alongside our teachers to support them delivering high quality Physical Education. As a school, we aspire to ensure that all children receive at least 2 hours of physical activity each week within curriculum time.

We have promoted the philosophy that being active is fun and that there is an activity out there for everyone. This has included providing instruction in a wide range of activities such as cycling, scooting, cross country running and gymnastics. We now provide a more varied PE and Sport Curriculum with the introduction of activities such as curling, table tennis, ultimate Frisbee and volleyball, which have all been taught during curriculum time this year.

We have provided additional specific training for children chosen to participate in local school sport events and competitions. This has included basketball, tag rugby, football, indoor and outdoor athletics, swimming and tennis. This focus saw Kingsmoor qualify to send teams in cycling and athletics to the Area Games Championships for Somerset schools during the Summer of 2016.

We have provided a variety of after school sport clubs, to encourage children to participate in more than 2 hours of physical activity a week. This has included clubs that targeted Key Stage 1 children (who have had fewer opportunities) and also less active children within our school.

We have purchased resources to enhance opportunities for increased participation at lunchtimes break times and to allow for the greater variety of activities taught in PE lessons. The most notable recent addition being the purchase of a set of bikes and safety helmets last year and the development of an all weather running pathway this year.

We have enabled all pupils to have a comprehensive swimming programme by subsidising the overall cost for all pupils.

The Sport Premium has helped the school to achieve the Sainsburys School Games Bronze Mark Award for our development of PE and school sport during the year 2015-2016.

How we intend to develop our PE & Sport provision in the academic year 2016-2017:

For the school year 2016 - 2017, we are hoping to build upon our previous Sainsburys School Games Bronze Mark award by achieving the Silver Mark. A key area to develop here is our provision of Intra school competition, where we are planning for key stage 1 & 2 children to compete in their Sports Teams during PE curriculum time.

We would also like to share more of the fantastic PE & Sport that is happening at Kingsmoor on our school website. This is likely to include PE curriculum information & overviews, sports fixtures, events & results, team photos, after school club achievements & dance festival videos.

Gymnastic resources will be improved for curricular and after school use.

Playtime equipment boxes will be restocked for non-structured periods of personal skills development
